The Margo Leavin Gallery is pleased to announce an exhibition of new works on paper by Sol LeWitt. This will be the artist's third exhibition with the gallery.

Since its beginning, Sol LeWitt's career has been marked by constant evolution through innovation and experimentation. His two-dimensional work has ranged from striking, subtle graphite drawings to bold, multicolored wall paintings. These new works on paper, each entitled *Horizontal Brushstrokes (More Or Less)*, showcase tri-colored, undulating brushstrokes that draw the eye across the image and off the page. The suggestion of infinity in both directions imbues the space with an air of calm expectation and unreserved tranquility.

Sol LeWitt was born in Hartford, Connecticut. He graduated with a BFA from Syracuse University in New York. He had his first solo exhibition in New York City in 1965, and has since gone on to become one of the world's most recognized modern artists. He has had retrospective exhibitions at the Museum of Modern art in New York in 1978, and the San Francisco Museum of Modern art in 2000. His wall drawings, sculptures, and works on paper can be found in most major public collections both nationally and internationally. LeWitt lives and works in Connecticut.
